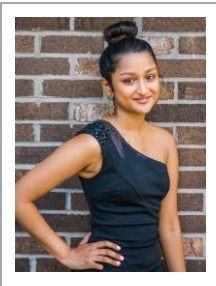

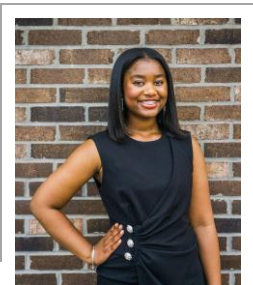

This year, the program has undergone additional changes.

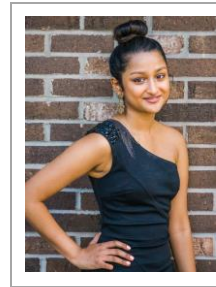
